## Mdina/Mosta/Dingli

Mdina, also known as the Silent City, is a fortified city in the north of Malta, which served as the island's capital from antiquity to the medieval period. The city is still confined within its walls, and is on the tentative list of UNESCO World Heritage Sites. En route to Mdina you can stop at Mdina Glass to see the glass blowers in action. You will enjoy a walk through the narrow winding streets of Mdina, reaching the bastions to enjoy a breathtaking view over the island. This tour will take you to Mosta, to see the Rotunda, a large church with the third largest unsupported dome in the world. Your last stop before dinner will be at Dingli Cliffs for a 15-minute photo stop.



## **Valletta**

Valletta (or Il-Belt) is the Capital of Malta. The City Wall was established in the 1500s on a peninsula by the Knights of St. John, a Roman Catholic Order. It is known for its museums, palaces and grand churches. The tour of Valletta will take you to the terraced Barrakka Gardens which offer views over the Grand Harbour and the refurbished Vittoriosa waterfront. You will then walk past some of the most important buildings and baroque landmarks. You will visit St. John's Co-Cathedral, an elaborately adorned 16th-century high baroque place of worship filled with marbles and European Masters, including the Caravaggio masterpiece titled "The Beheading of Saint John."



## Bingemma/Victoria Lines/Golden Sands

Bingemma forms part of the 12km long Victoria Lines which runs along the top of a natural geographical barrier in Malta known as the Great Fault. The name Victoria Lines comes from the completion of a line of forts and defences along the route, which is highly scenic. During this tour you will view a number of wayside chapels along the route as well as being able to see Gozo with its white cliffs in the background and Mgarr Village in the Valley. You will also be able to enjoy Golden Sands beach around sunset.
